

This will assist members of national societies to discover and attend other national meetings. Europe is a rich source of separation science activities and access to them via cheap flights and rail connections has never been better.

One of the benefits of belonging to The ChromSoc is we offer discounted registration fees to members on all EuSSS and British Mass Spectrometry Society and some Royal Society of Chemistry meetings with reciprocal arrangements in place.
